CALL MEETING TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Liquor Control Board for Harford County was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chair Goddard at the Board's office. In attendance were Vice Chair Majewski, Commissioners Sines, Walters, and Miller, GM Crabbs, and Board Counsel Finneran.

Charge 1:

A license holder shall operate the licensed premises in a manner as to avoid disturbing peace, health, safety, and welfare of the community per Md. Code Ann., ABCA § 4-210; ABCA §4-604; and Board Rule 3:10

Charge 2:

License holders and their agents and employees shall cooperate with all representatives of any governmental agencies; including, but not limited to, the Board, the Harford County Health Department, the State Fire Marshal's Office, Harford County Government, and any municipal governments, whenever such persons are engaged in official business per Board Rule 3:02 (a).

Following testimony from Chief Inspector Daniel Buchler, Bel Air Chief of Police Charles Moore, and the License Holder, motion was made by Commissioner Sines and was seconded to convene to executive session under the General Provisions Art. § 3-305(b)(7) to consult with counsel to obtain legal advice; the vote was unanimous. On return to open session and subsequent to the hearing, the Board considered all the evidence presented. Based upon the statement of facts (i.e., the written report of Chief Inspector Daniel Buchler), as well as Chief Moore's and License Holder's testimony and with further consideration to License Holder's relevant past record (if any), the Board made the following finding:

On Charge 1, motion was made by Commissioner Sines and was seconded to find License Holder in violation; the vote was unanimous. Motion was made by Commissioner Sines and was seconded to suspend the alcoholic beverage license from 12:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. for thirty (30) days beginning October 9; the vote was unanimous.

On Charge 2, motion was made by Commissioner Sines and was seconded to find License Holder in violation; the vote was unanimous. Motion was made by Commissioner Sines and was seconded to impose a fine in the amount of \$2,000.00; the vote was unanimous.
